Cancellations seem to be the name of the game for this summer. Maybe it was something as small as your summertime soiree with your posse. Maybe it was something as cherished as gathering with friends on the high school football field to celebrate America's Independence with fireworks next to Bald Knob. Maybe it was something international like the Summer Olympics in Tokyo. Maybe it was something regional like FloydFest.

Whatever it is, I'd be willing to bet you've experienced a cancellation this summer. They have been more commonplace than events keeping their regular schedule. The question that arises then is "how do Christians respond when life is topsy-turvy or our schedules get wrecked?"

Thankfully, the Bible is clear about this - we persevere.

I'm reminded of Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount - "do not worry about tomorrow for tomorrow has enough worries of its own." Much energy can be wasted if we worry about what tomorrow will bring. Instead, we should focus on today.

A pastor friend once gave me this line that if you forgive its cheesiness is a helpful aphorism: "Today is all we have and it's a gift. That's why they call it the present."

Does anyone know what the Fall looks like? No, they don't. You don't. I don't. We don't. We have hypotheses, guesses based upon good evidence. However, to speak with 100% certainty about what will and won't take place is the stuff of God.

What has been especially freeing for me, someone who wants to clutch tightly to my plans for the future, has been to let go. This season has forced surrender for me. It has forced surrender for any of the months ending in y, h, l, e, and r. And that's a good thing. When we cling too tightly to our well-made and well-meaning plans, we can easily become victims to despair. "But I made a plan, God! I had it in the calendar! I made reservations!" Despair sets in and we crumble like a cookie. Being too tied to the future is often a tie to our worth. You're not more worthy because your calendar is jammed with more things. "You are a mist," James tells us, and boasting about your schemes is "evil." Instead, you can practice the ministry of the here and now. The here and now is where that person, that conversation, that kid, or that meeting that you're in or with, they're the ones you need to be concerned about right now. Surrender to it, and you'll be freer. Also, surrender enables us to enjoy these here and now moments, not just the ones that are yet to come. What if today was the day that the Lord has made, not just tomorrow or next week's trip to Cancun (spoiler alert: today *is* the day)? Truly, whenever you're reading this is the only day you have. Make the most of it. Why not? Today isn't cancelled.

Persevere church. Don't give up. This is a marathon not a sprint. If it gets cancelled, maybe that's a hint that you can focus on today even more.
