The Samaritan offering for Virginia United Methodist Homes will be received from Mother's Day, May 9, through



Dear RMUMC,

I grew up next to a small lake. There was a dock off that lake, filled with the kind of boards that grow up just longing to be splinters. That didn't bother me or the other boys who lived down the road who'd come over to jump off that dock. We'd make leaps that if Cirque du Soleil scouts had seen us, we'd have joined the circus in no time.

Eventually, we'd get bored with flipping and diving. We needed some competition. Impromptu contests would be declared, rules would be decided on, and feats of human strength would commence. One of our favorite ones was stealing the tennis ball from the mouth of Duke, our golden retriever, finding an old stick, and hitting the tar out of that ball. We'd mash that ball across the lake, thinking ourselves little Hammerin' Hank Aarons. The outfielders would have to swim for the ball, and the dog would watch contentedly from foul territory.

When that got old, we'd come up with another contest, swimming to the bottom of the lake. We'd psyche ourselves up for it, talking smack, and tightening the drawstring on our swimming trunks. Right before we tested the limits of our lungs, we'd make dramatic heaves of our chest as we took in oxygen. Then, like the swimmers down at the 1996 Atlanta Olympics, we'd dive into that mountain lake and beat our legs as we journeyed to the murky depths. Once, we found an old lawn chair that had been thrown in the lake after a particularly fiery boy fight. Another time, a neighbor kid said he got bit by a snapping turtle. Most times though, we'd declare that we had touched the bottom after racing upwards and breathing in that life-giving O_2 .

Whenever I'd breach the air layer, I'd gulp air like it was going out style. No matter how big a swallow of air I took before I dove, at some point at the bottom, I'd think, "this is it. I'm not going to make it up in time." Of course, I'd never tell the other boys that. I stuck my chest out proudly and exclaimed that the snapping turtle is lucky to swim away after the underwater whooping I put on it. Quietly though, I'd throw back huge breaths, happy to be on this side of the water.

That's how it is with God sometimes too. Trust can be elusive. Anxiety shows up at a moment's notice. When we get down, really down, we can think that God won't raise us up out of the water. Peter said, "Lord save me," once he saw that he couldn't save himself. He gulped air too, thinking it was in short supply. Maybe we beat our chest, tell the other kids we weren't scared. But we were.

Our family intends to spend a lot of time this summer in the water. One day, I pray, I'll swim to the bottom and know, really know, that God is with me even in the depths. Sure, I'll still take big swallows of air before I dive, but maybe this is the summer, I can smile when I touch the bottom, knowing that I'll make it back up. Maybe this year is the one where I can declare with the psalmist in 139, "even in the depths you, God, are there." Maybe, this is the summer.
