"I feel it in the air Summer's out of reach" —Don Henley

Don Henley wrote these lyrics back in the '80s and "Boys of Summer" became a mega-hit for the Eagles' drummer. It's since been covered by the Ataris and was released as a cover to huge acclaim in the 2000s. This is one of those songs that is built for Mustangs and long drives across America. It's a great tune.

In the song, Henley talks about something being lost when the summer fades into fall. Maybe he's feeling nostalgic, maybe he's just not looking forward to fall's chill. Whatever it is, summer is fading.

Some despise "Boys of Summer" because they're fall devotees. For many, fall is a favorite. There is an entire subclass of people who travel to the mountains to look at leaves. The leaves in the cities and on the coast are subpar, and thus, travel is necessitated to enjoy oranges and reds emblazoned on the deciduous trees. Fall brings apple picking back into popularity. It is a fine time for hanging by a campfire and enjoying the fellowship of friends and s'mores. Pumpkins are butchered and faces applied on said pumpkins. "Bring on fall; forget summer's heat, humidity and 'skeeters," these fall folks exclaim.

Outside the parsonage window stand stately trees that will soon become a riot of color and very quickly, drop their leaves onto East Church Street. The leaf-laden limbs will become barren and empty. The Don Henleys of the world mourn the loss of the leaves; the fall folks see it as a necessary part of the process to see some yellow leaves.

What we all lose in terms of leaves, we gain in terms of view. The sky is more visible. The clouds can be seen more easily. The birds soaring above can be seen without craning one's neck around a pesky branch. This leads me to wonder: What if what we *do* see overtakes what we *don't*? What if the azure blue skies we gain because the leaves are off are fall's blessing? Yes, the trees seem smaller because their leaves are gone, but the sky in all its cerulean color steps to center stage.

So, it is with the person who gives his or her life over to the Lord. John the Baptist once said, in order for him to increase, "I must decrease." When we are in Christ, we are a new creation, the old has gone and the new has come. This means we who are in Christ talk less about what we ourselves are doing and become smaller and smaller in our esteem. Meanwhile Christ becomes more and more. If you wish to evaluate your growth in Christ, is Christ becoming more and more the centerpiece?

In other words, are the sky, the clouds and the birds getting their chance to shine? Is Jesus more in you than ever before? Might be something to ponder, boy of summer. Might be something to consider, female of fall.




