

Dear RMUMC,

While on the high school ski trip to Canaan Valley, WV a month ago, I learned how to give a better no. The other two chaperones on the trip, Ashley and Jimmy Amos, brought their two high school aged boys along, Jackson and Lucas. These boys are good boys. Christians. Scouts. The kind of boys moms and dads of little girls want their daughters to go to prom with. Yet, they're still human, prone to mistakes.

At some point, one of the boys was dragging his feet, and we were waiting on them. This didn't sit well with Ashley and Jimmy, and they started fussing at their boys. Not yelling & screaming fussing, but some good old-fashioned, run-of-the-mill fussing. "Come on now, we can't wait all day." "You weren't raised in a barn; come on!" "Get to moving...Chop! Chop!"

I watched in awe as their folksy, yet effective, fussing got their boys to get in gear. Right quick, the boys did get a move on, and we were able to do whatever it was we were waiting to do. I asked Jimmy and Ashley to show me, a new dad, how to say no. They gave me a Masterclass on how to say no, to "encourage," and to get your progeny to get a move on. "Do this," "Scowl like this," and "Straighten your back in this manner." I took notes.

These parents are great parents. They're involved without being helicopter parents. They're sweet and tough. They're loving, always. And it was clear to their boys that their fussing wasn't without merit, and their fussing wasn't without love.

Which gets me to our God and the season of Lent.

Lent can get off the rails, awfully quickly. Lent can become a festival of self-loathing. Ash Wednesday hits and we want to turn on the "Oh woe is me." While this style of self-flagellation might work in recognizing one's sinfulness, it skews one's understanding of the Lord. It makes the Lord out to be a slave-driving taskmaster whose sole joy in life is to crush us underfoot. A certain way of "celebrating" Lent sucks every ounce of celebration out of this season before Easter. Mean God and a depressing Lent.

In the Gospels, there is a story of Jesus going into the Wilderness to be tempted by the Devil. He's tempted with hunger, power, and deliverance from his troubles. Rather than turning from the temptation, he turns to Scripture to remind him of the God he serves. An observation of Lent that makes God into a sadist isn't Biblical. God desires that all sinners be saved. The Lord is compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. A no from God does not make God a monster; it reminds us that He is a parent.

May you have a holy Lent, knowing the no helps draw you closer to the greater yes coming on Easter.
