To Know Jesus And To Share His Love

Dear RMUMC,

Black History Month is now over, but that doesn't mean that we can't learn about one of the most important Black Americans and a pillar of the Christian faith, Isabella Baumfree, who later changed her name to Sojourner Truth. Baumfree lived in the late 18th and mid-19th centuries. She was a slave for most of her early years. After several owners in her early life, she escaped and found her way to the home of a Quaker couple in the Hudson Valley of New York. They paid twenty dollars for her freedom, and Isabella Baumfree was a freed person by age 17.

After her conversion to Christianity, she changed her name to Sojourner because she said she was on a journey to share the good news of Christ to those she met. The outflow of this was her mission to abolish slavery in America. She was quick-witted, and indomitable. Early in her years as a freed person, she sued her former owner. She won the case, arguing that her former owner sold her son after New York's emancipation law had taken effect. This was the first time in American history that a black woman had sued a white man and won the case.

Truth fought valiantly for women's rights, as well as emancipation. Her most famous sermon was "Ain't I A Woman?" and in the sermon, she declared "That man over there says that women need to be helped into carriages and lifted over ditches and to have the best place everywhere. Nobody helps me any best place. And ain't I a woman? Look at me! Look at my arm. I have plowed, I have planted, and I have gathered into barns. And no man could head me. And ain't I a woman?" Just because she was a woman did not mean she couldn't work and fight and because of this, she demanded equal rights under the law.

As we head into Lent, often what is only preached and taught is that we must turn inward, to investigate our own individual hearts soberly and somberly. Without a doubt this is Lenten at its core. Yet, as James famously tells us, "faith without works is dead." Look inward, yes, but also look outward at the people who have shown that they will not be overcome by darkness. Examples like Sojourner Truth are good. Truth refused to let literal slavery stop her from her mission, given by God, to see her people emancipated and her gender elevated. We are heartened by these persons because we know that personal piety should not exist in a bubble. "Out of the heart, the mouth speaks," Jesus said. If we are feeding our hearts with the goodness and grace of Christ, the result should be that we live for more than self. We live with a mission and purpose.

Here's a challenge, find a spiritual warrior from history that you can latch onto, whose example you can learn more about. As you do, you may find that as you look upon your heart, you then look upon our world and seek to engage it in new and profound ways as you live out your faith.

Unfortunately, they often fall short. Just think how many items in your closet or kitchen have been ruined by stubborn stains.


What if we were that concerned about ridding our lives and hearts of sin? What if we spent as much time confessing and repenting as scrubbing and laundering?


