To Know Jesus And To Share His Love

Dear RMUMC,

As of this day, April 20, 2023, India has now surpassed China as the most populous country. The population of India is now 1,408,000,000! Do you know that if you live to be 80 years old, you'll only take 672,768,000 breaths? That means that there are twice as many people in India than there are breaths in your life.

Numbers of people have always fascinated me. I remember poring over the World Book in our elementary school library. This book gave statistics about how many sheep live in New Zealand vs. how many humans do (it's more sheep than humans). It would tell the number of people that live in the smallest country in the World, The Vatican (it's 825 at this time). It would spout statistics like the world's highest mountain, Earth's deepest point, our globe's longest country, and the narrowest gap between two continents. (Everest, Mariana Trench, Russia, Gibraltar between Spain and Morocco). You could travel between all these places with the turn of a page. Of all these facts, what drew me back in was the size of the largest countries, and for the longest time, it has been China.

Now, with India eclipsing China, elementary students will lay atop these oversized books and learn about oversized populations in another land. I can almost hear the World Book editors changing the fact of who is number one right now.

What often gets lost in the dizzying numbers we see are the human lives that these numbers represent. Each life is filled with wonder, fear, boredom, and desire. Each life has people they love, people they despise and people they don't even think about. Each life has a story, and each life matters to the Lord. Each life is a person *given* by the Lord.

Back in 2020, there was a debate that raged in America about who mattered. Some put up Black Lives Matter signs. Others put up Blue Lives Matter signs. Others still put up All Lives Matter signs. Like many of our initially fruitful conversations in America, it descended into name-calling and vitriol. We believe as Americans that "all men are endowed by their Creator with certain inalienable rights: life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness." We believe as Christians that all people are given the image of God, imprinted on their hearts and soul. And we affirm that there is no one that you'll ever lock eyes with that God doesn't love.

As India becomes the most populated country now, we acknowledge we will never, ever know all 1.408 billion people in that country. We won't know all the people in China, now #2 in the world. We won't know all of America (sitting pretty in the #3 slot), all of Virginia, all of Franklin County, or all of Rocky Mount. But we know this, that God loves each individual so much that He sent Jesus to show God's love to all of them. You matter to God, no matter where you live, or where you are in the World Book.



The power of (God's) light

Do most people truly feel happier in spring? Is the light brighter, the sky bluer? Meteorologists say yes. The shorter, blue wavelengths of sunlight scatter more efficiently than long, red ones; as the sun rises higher in spring, the light passes through less atmosphere, making the sky appear bluer. Outdoor levels of light have proven as effective as Prozac to combat depression — and May is the sunniest month!

The Bible frequently uses light as a metaphor for God: "The Lord is my light and my salvation" (Psalm 27:1); "Let us walk in the light of the Lord" (Isaiah 2:5); "The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world" (John 1:9). Darkness isn't bad; seeds sprout in dark soil, life begins in the dark womb, and darkness protected the Hebrews fleeing Pharaoh and the holy family fleeing Herod.

But light is one apt image for God because most of us know the joy, health and energy light brings. Both in spring and through faith in the God who enlightens all, may we "live as children of light" (Ephesians 5:8).
