 To Know Jesus And To Share His Love

Dear RMUMC,

I'm unashamed about being a history nerd. Recently, our son Zeke and I went on a grand history tour of battlefields of the American Revolutionary War. South Carolina has plenty of them, and we visited King's Mountain, Cowpens, and Ninety-Six. If you're into history, take a trip to Palmetto State (probably not this time of year - HOT!). Learn about the Lord Cornwallis and Daniel Morgan, read the fiery letters Patrick Ferguson sent to the folks not too far from here and how those letters may have caused the turning point in the Revolutionary War, and gain a deeper sense of why freedom matters to the people of the Appalachians. Examine some of the earliest trench warfare in history, over a hundred years before WWI. (See, now I'm going full-blown history nerd on you).

If you don't want to have to go to South Carolina for history, check out the recently renovated Archives Room in the church. I'm delighted by the work that the Gibsons, Benny and Martha Sue, and Linda Handy have done in restoring that room. It's a treasure! You can read all about folks like Charlotte Seegars and Mary Elizabeth Angle, and you can look at pictures of the former church building that was on Maple Avenue. It's a fabulous space for study and devotional reading. The church is open for prayer at any time. While stopping by to pray, take a walk down memory lane.

The work in the Archives Room along with this recent trip to South Carolina with our son has sparked a renewed interest in some of the saints of the church. As a United Methodist clergyperson, I swore an oath to uphold the *Discipline of the United Methodist Church*. (Consider the *Discipline* the guiding laws for how a UMC is structured.) One of the aspects of that *Discipline* is that clergypersons "ensure faithful transmission of the Christian faith." Surely, one of the ways that I attempt to do that is tell you about people who throughout church history did just that. In other words, one of the ways to know how to do faith now is to see how faith was done in the past.

During the month of July, I will preach five sermons that lift up the lives of five saints from history. I'm naming the sermon series, "Superheroes." These people were given superhuman ability by God, and they became heroes to those they served.

This foray into history shouldn't bore you because you're the beneficiary of their faith. The people are John Wesley, Thérèse of Lisieux, Martin Luther, Thomas Merton, and Jarena Lee. Some of these may be familiar, some may be brand-new to you. I invite you to read up on them now and learn what you can about their fascinating lives of faith. History should enliven our lives and provide examples of how an ordinary person can do extraordinary work for the Lord.


